



The Collaborative Assessment & Management of Suicidality (CAMS)

What is CAMS?

CAMS is an evidenced-based treatment framework used to assess suicidality and specifically treat suicide risk. CAMS 3-part training provides mental health professionals with essential knowledge in using the CAMS framework to collaborate with patients in the treatment of their suicidal drivers.

6 published correlational studies & an RCT support the effectiveness of CAMS in reducing patients' suicidal drivers.

What Does CAMS Training Include?

CAMS' 3-part training includes:

- 1) **A 3-4 hour, self-paced online course:** This course features a series of videos which provide an overview of the CAMS model. Completion of the online course is required prior to in-person, role-play workshop.
- 2) **An in-person, 1 day workshop:** Amy Brausch, Ph.D., Associate Professor with Western Kentucky University and Clinical Psychologist, will train participants in using the CAMS framework through role-play where participants take turns acting as both counselors and patients.
- 3) **Group consultation calls:** Following the workshop, group phone calls will be held for 8 weeks, providing opportunity to discuss successes and challenges as participants implement the CAMS model.

Upon completion of role-play workshop, participants will receive 10 CEUs. The OhioMHAS Continuing Education Committee is an approved provider of Continuing Education Unites (CEUs) for RNs, LPNs, Ohio Counselors, Marriage & Family Therapists, Social Workers, Chemical Dependency Professionals, and Psychologists.
